FIELD TRIP ADMISSION FEES:

- ★ **FREE** – One adult for every five children
- ★ **\$3.00** – Children, students and additional chaperones

FIELD TRIP ADMISSION POLICY:

- ★ Groups must be a minimum of 8 children to qualify for field trip rates.
- ★ Field trips are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis between 9:00 am and 3:00 pm, Tuesdays through Fridays. (Monday trips may be available upon request, depending on staff availability.)
- ★ Field trips generally last 1½ – 2 hours.
- ★ One adult chaperone is required for every five (5) children.
- ★ Pre-registration is required for the field trip rate.
- ★ Family memberships are not valid for field trip visits.
- ★ A non-refundable \$15.00 deposit is required upon registration and will be deducted from your final bill. The remaining balance is due the day of your trip. Cash, checks and credit cards accepted.
- ★ Before your visit, you will receive a confirmation packet full of museum information and extended classroom activities ideal for before, during and after your visit!
- ★ All streets surrounding CMFDL have metered parking available on both sides of the street. Additional parking is available in the Fond du Lac Public Library lot, with entrances on Marr Street and Portland Street.

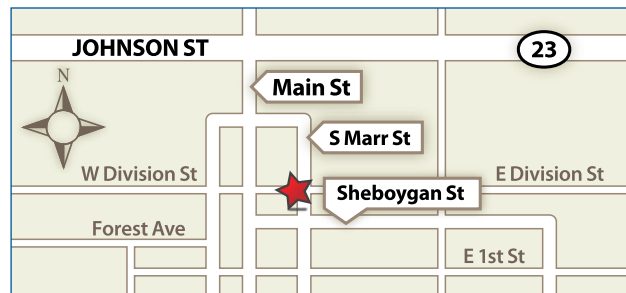
directions to the museum

FROM NORTH OR SOUTH:

- ★ Take US-41 northbound or southbound. Exit at Highway 23, exit #99. Take Hwy. 23 east to Main Street. Turn right (south) onto Main Street. Turn left (east) onto Sheboygan Street. CMFDL is two blocks down on your left.

FROM EAST OR WEST:

- ★ Take Highway 23/Johnson Street to Main Street. Turn south onto Main Street. Turn left (east) onto Sheboygan Street. CMFDL is two blocks down on your left.
