Tony likes to help his father at their small family restaurant, but everything changes when Little Nino's Pizzeria becomes a fancier place.
- Giganti, Paul **Each Orange Had Eight Slices: a counting book.** Harpercollins, 1992
A vibrant introduction to mathematics.
- Harris, Nancy **Is an Inchworm an Inch?: measuring with fractions** Rourke, 2008
Holub, Joan **The Pizza That We Made** Viking, 2001
Three young cooks have fun making their own pizza, cleaning up their mess, and eating hot slices!
- Hulme, Joy **Mary Clare Likes to Share** Random House, 2006
Mary Clare divides treats into halves, thirds, or other fractional parts to make sure that each of her friends or family members can enjoy an equal share.
- Labatt, Mary **Pizza for Sam** Kids Can Press, 2003
Sam the puppy prefers pizza instead of his standard puppy chow.
- Lewin, Ted **Big Jimmy's Kum Kau Chinese Take-Out** HarperCollins, 2001
Out of Print. The sights, sounds and smells of a busy Chinese take-out restaurant are seen through the eyes of the owner's young son.
- London, Jonathan **Froggy Eats Out** Viking, 2001
After Froggy misbehaves at a fancy restaurant, his parents take him to a fast flies restaurant to celebrate their anniversary.
- McMillan, Bruce **Eating Fractions** Scholastic, 1991
Out of Print. Food is cut into halves, quarters, and thirds to illustrate how parts make a whole.
- McPhail, David **Piggy's Pancake Parlor** Dutton, 2002
Piggy and Fox open a restaurant where they serve the delicious pancakes that Piggy makes by adding a secret ingredient.
- Murphy, Stuart **Give Me Half!** HarperCollins, 1996
Introduces the concept of halves using a simple rhyming story about a bother and sister who do not want to share their food.
- Napoli, Donna **The Wishing Club: a story about fractions** Henry Holt, 2007
When four siblings wish on a star, each gets only a fraction of what he or she wanted, but when they combine their wishes, they just might get a whole new pet.
- Peterson, Cris **Extra Cheese, Please!: mozzarella's journey from cow to pizza** Boyds Mills, 1994
When Annabelle gives birth to her calf, she also begins to produce milk, which is then processed into cheese, and from the cheese, pizza.
- Steig, William **Pete's a Pizza** HarperCollins, 1998
What do you do when Pete's in a bad mood? When it is raining and he cannot go out and play? Turn him into a pizza, of course!
- Sturges, Philemon **The Little Red Hen (makes a pizza)** Dutton, 1999
In this version of the traditional tale, the duck, the dog, and the cat refuse to help the Little Red Hen make a pizza but do get to participate when the times comes to eat it.

Waber, Bernard **Fast Food! Gulp! Gulp!** Houghton Mifflin, 2001
All kinds of foods are served faster and faster—until the cook has had enough!

Walter, Virginia **Hi, Pizza Man!** Orchard Books, 1995
Out of Print. While a young girl waits for the delivery of a hot pizza, she provides the appropriate animal sounds for a variety of pretend animal pizza deliverers.

Wellington, Monica **Pizza at Sally's** Dutton, 2006
With vegetables from her own garden and other fresh ingredients, Sally mixes and bakes hot and bubbly pizzas for her customers to take home or eat in her pizzeria.

Ziefert, Harriet **Rabbit and Hare Divide an Apple** Viking, 1998
Because both Rabbit and Hare insist on having the larger piece of mushroom, they lose the whole thing to a sly skunk but learn an important lesson in the process.
