Rhyming text and illustrations portray piloting various forms of transportation including hot air balloons and bicycles.
- Brillhart, Julie **Molly Rides the School Bus** Whitman, 2002
Molly is worried about riding the school bus on her first day of kindergarten, but a friendly older girl helps her adjust.
- Crew, Donald **School Bus** Greenwillow, 1984
Follows the path of a school bus on its daily travels.
- Dale, Penny **The Boy on the Bus** Candlewick Press, 2007
Various farm animals make their own sounds as a young boy takes them on a bus ride through the countryside.
- Ellis, Sarah **Next Stop!** Fitzhenry & Whiteside, 2000
Claire helps her Day who is a city bus driver.
- Frost, Helen **We Need School Bus Drivers** Capstone, 2005
Simple text and photographs describe the role of school bus drivers.
- Kirk, Daniel **Bus Stop, Bus Go!** Putnam's, 2001
Out of Print. An escaped hamster enlivens the ride on an already chaotic school bus.

Simple text describes school buses, what they look like, and what they do.

Patty and her younger sister have exciting adventures, from deep under the ocean to Mars, in a magical bus.

Rhythmic sounds imitate trains, planes and other busy transports that come and go.
